While many roofs, gutters and downspouts have been replaced this summer, supply chain issues are delaying other repairs. If you still have OBVIOUS damage to the outside of your home that has not yet been repaired, such as broken windows, damaged siding, doors, fencing, etc., the Board requests that you inform us of an estimated timeline for your repairs.

You MUST get board approval if you are making any color and/or material changes to the outside of your home (color of siding, shingles, garage doors, etc.) that will deviate from the current look of your home. Please refer to the Design Review Manual and Design Review Application which can be found at heatherlake.org for reference.

Earth tone colors include subtle, neutral shades of tan, taupe, beige, ivory or gray. Additionally, all roofs in Heather Lake are architectural dimensional asphalt shingles; 3-tab shingles are not acceptable. mailbox maintenance update

Each home in Heather Lake is required to have the approved "Duffey" mailbox. If you were notified by letter last year that your mailbox is not an approved "Duffey" it is time to replace it. If you were notified that your mailbox needed repaired or repainted and you have not done so, please do so as soon as possible. Most of our mailboxes suffered hail damage this Spring so even if you repainted it last year, it may require attention again. You can purchase a new mailbox at Cedar Craft Products, Inc., www.cedarcraft.com or (614) 759-1600. The mailbox reference code is #HLK7/Q1B Heather Lake. The price to remove and replace (providing no concrete is involved) is \$296.44 plus tax. If your mailbox needs painted, the approved paint, Benjamin Moore Annapolis Gray can be purchased at Fairfield Paint, 3032 Columbus Lancaster Road in Lancaster, or matched at your favorite paint supplier. Many neighbors share the cost of a can.
