The board has adopted a new Renewable Energy Policy, developed and recommended by the Architectural Review Board. The policy is included in this mailing with the 1st half dues invoice and June newsletter. The policy will also be available at www.heatherlake.org in the Review tab.

Notes from the March and April Meetings:

- No homeowners volunteered to serve for open board positions.
- In compliance with COVID-19 directives, the April meeting was attended via Zoom.
- Due to excessive rainfall, grass planting has to be postponed until the lake drainage area is postponed until mid-Summer or later.
- New geese decoys were ordered to continue deterring geese around the lake. A few geese managed to nest and will not leave, but we have far fewer geese than in recent years.

The original decaying and vandalized wooden post signs have now been replaced with higher visibility metal signs. Thanks to Robert Ware for all the research and hard work over the past year to get these signs replaced.
